## College Scholarship Application

To promote the organization's goals and to encourage post high school education for children/grandchildren of I.A.A.A. members, the Idaho Athletic Administrators Association will award two \$500.00 scholarships to selected graduating high school senior children /grandchildren of current I.A.A.A. members.

The selection committee will review all applications and select two recipients. Those awarded the scholarships will be notified by telephone and letter, and will be honored at the I.A.A.A. Spring Conference April 3, 2012. All applicants will be notified of the decision in writing no later than March 15, 2012. Scholarships will be submitted to the college upon enrollment. (Note: If there are not enough high school seniors eligible, college/professional trade school students may apply.)

## Selection Criteria

- Only completed applications received on or before the deadline will be considered. **Deadline is February 10, 2012.**
- The applicant must be a graduating high school senior and the child/grandchild or legal ward of a current I.A.A.A. member.
- The applicant shall have a minimum 3.0 cumulative high school grade point average; transcripts must accompany the application.
- The applicant must have participated in high school athletics or activities some time during grades 9-12. Attach a description of this participation with your application.
- The applicant shall have demonstrated service to their school, and/or community, and good citizenship. A description of these activities should be included.
- The applicant must attach an essay on the listed topic with their application. This will be judged on content, writing style and mechanics.
- The applicant must include letters of recommendation from at least two school officials. (principal, athletic director, coach, teacher, counselor) The person making the recommendation may not be related to the applicant, or an I.A.A.A. member.
- To be eligible, the qualifying Athletic Director must be current or have been active for at least five (5) years.
- The scholarship candidate must have attended an Idaho high school.
